

RIGHT OF ADMISSION IN A SITUATION OF A COVID PANDEMIC

Dear Pearly Grey guest/s,

All tourists, over 12 years of age, who want to check in a tourist accommodation will have to provide ONE of the following for check in:

- **Vaccination certificate** that proves that the holder has received a vaccine against COVID-19. You must be fully vaccinated and have received your last dose at least 14 days before arrival in Spain. Any vaccine will be admitted that has been authorised for commercial use by the [EU \(European Medicines Agency - EMA\)](#) and the [WHO](#).
- Certificate indicating the negative result of a **COVID-19 Active Infection Diagnostic Test** performed on the holder. Antigen tests performed a maximum of 48 hours prior to arrival in Spain will be accepted, as will NAAT tests (PCR, TMA, LAMP) performed a maximum of 72 hours prior to arrival in Spain. **Only NAAT tests will be accepted for people travelling from the United Kingdom.**
- A certificate stating that the holder **has recovered from COVID-19**, issued at least 11 days after your first positive NAAT (PCR, TMA, LAMP) test. The certificate is valid for 180 days. **People travelling from the UK cannot use this option.**

If you travel from another autonomous community within Spain:

- Test negative for active COVID-19 infection in the 72 hours prior to arrival in the Canary Islands. Compulsory . The tests that are allowed are PCR (RT-PCR for COVID-19), Transcription Mediated Amplification (TMA), and Antigen tests that detect SARS-COV-2 antigens with an accuracy of 97% and a sensitivity of over 80% as defined in their supporting documentation.

You don't have to present a test if you:

- Children under the age of 12.
- Are in transit through a port or airport in the Canary Islands but your final destination is in another country or a different region of Spain.
- Can prove that you have been outside the Canary Islands for less than 72 hours prior to your arrival, regardless of your place of residence.
- Have an official accredited document that shows that you have been fully vaccinated prior to your trip or have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine authorised by the European Medicines Agency (EMA) within the past four months and at least 15 days prior to your trip. The official vaccination document must state which vaccine was received, the number of doses and the date each dose was administered.

- Can prove with an official medical certificate or public document that you have had and recovered from the disease within the past 6 months.
